Like any other industry, some of them are better than others. For that reason, I wanted to let other authors know that I have had an excellent publishing experience with Infinity Publishing (www.infinitypublishing.com). Only a few weeks after submitting my manuscript to them in disc format, I received two copies of the finished product delivered to my door via first class mail. The art work on the cover of my book is nothing short of eye-catching professionalism--and they completed it with no input or suggestions from me. The few changes I requested in the body of the finished manuscript (fixing typos and formatting changes that I had overlooked) were completed quickly and free of charge. Orders I have placed for copies of my book, always in excess of 50 to 100 per order, were delivered to my door via UPS within days--and Infinity paid for the shipping.
